

#### FSCJ Promise Provides Pathway to College



Earlier this month, Florida State College at Jacksonville announced its **FSCJ Promise** program, which commits to paying "last dollar" costs for low-income, full-time students. FSCJ Promise is the first program of its kind in the state and, starting this fall, will fully fund the first two years at FSCJ (tuition, fees and books) for eligible local students. The program plans to provide support for students through the creation of a college-going culture while increasing student persistence and degree completion for first-time-in-college students. 
