2018 Florida College Access Network Summit draws record audience

Two-day convening gathers more than 375 leaders and professionals from throughout Florida

Orlando, FL — Florida College Access Network (FCAN) hosted its sixth annual summit on May 10-11, 2018 at the Hyatt Regency Orlando, to a record audience!

- Policy Talk: A Conversation with Florida Rep. Carlos Guillermo Smith featured a conversation with Rep. Carlos Guillermo Smith (D-49) moderated by Marlene Spalten, President and CEO of the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay.
- Awards Luncheon: The Future's Bright! was sponsored by Wells Fargo and honored the winners of the 2018 Florida FAFSA Challenge and FCAN's Florida Unsung Heroes of Resilience Awards. The awards ceremony was followed by a keynote address from Tony Carvajal, Executive Vice President of the Florida Chamber Foundation, and Dr. Jerry D.
