


Florida College Access Network


Our mission: To create and strengthen a statewide network that catalyzes and supports communities to improve college and career readiness, access, and completion for all students

The Mentoring Gap

With a mentor, at-risk youth are:

- 46% *less* likely than their peers to start using drugs
- 52% *less* likely than their peers to skip a day of school
- 55% *more* likely to enroll in college
- 81% *more* likely to report participating regularly in sports or extracurricular activities




Program Model

- 5. Offering Alternative Platforms for Mentoring


